

- Research has shown that higher GCSEpod users* achieved <u>at least</u> <u>one grade higher across those</u> GCSE subjects.

Ongoing assessment and exam preparation

Assessment is vital in ensuring that staff, and students are able to build upon strengths and identify areas of weakness to improve upon. Ensuring students are prepared for their assessments is crucial. In Year 10 there will be:

- Two formal assessment weeks during Year 10.
- Mocks exams at the end of Year 10.
- Mocks exams in Year 11.
- Regular feedback for students and parents on targets and predicted grades, as well as effort, homework and attitude to learning.

Study support

- An opportunity for students to complete work and extra revision
- The study support rooms have access to computers
- It's a quiet resourced area for students to come and work
- It runs from 3-4pm Monday-Thursday



How parents can help

Parental support is 8 times more important in determining a child's academic success than social class (Campaign for Learning research)



The best conditions

- Encourage a healthy diet, hydration, exercise, sleep
- Talk through Progress Checks, ask about homework, get them to show you GCSEpod, their timetables etc.
- Encourage a positive mind set
- Encourage your child to ask if unsure
- Encourage them to make the most of opportunities available
- Encourage ongoing revision, from DAY ONE!
- Have key dates visible, and refer to them regularly.



Reading is crucial



- Reading for pleasure is more important for children's cognitive development than their parents' level of education.
- Reading books is the only out-of-school activity for 16-year-olds demonstrably linked to securing managerial or professional jobs.
- 10 to 16 year-olds who read for pleasure do better at school.
- Parents are the most important reading role models for children and young people.
- Across the country, boys read at a lower level than girls. This affects their ability to pass English GCSE and lowers their success in other subjects.
- Where boys read for just 15 minutes a day, the impact on all of their learning has been shown to be transformational.

Attendance and Punctuality

- Excellent attendance is crucial in supporting your child with their learning goals and achieving their highest grades.
- Equally important is PUNCTUALITY to registrations and to all lessons.
- 90% attendance over a school year = 4 whole weeks of lessons
 MISSED!
- Research suggests that **17 missed school days** a year

= 1 GCSE grade **DROP** in achievement.

The greater the attendance the greater the attainment.
