

- Expectations are still very high
- Demands and challenges are even greater
- GCSE subjects will require greater depth of study and new skills
- Every lesson, every homework, every piece of work – all will make a difference
- It's not all about results, but...
- Results will determine next steps, and that affects all future plans
- 100% **effort** will give the best results

Some facts about the GCSEs

- All GCSEs are graded from 9 to 1
- More challenging content than the 'old' GCSEs
- A grade 4 and above is a 'standard pass'; this is the minimum level that students need to reach in English and maths, otherwise they will need to continue to study these subjects post-16
- The DfE has said to employers, universities and colleges that if a grade C was their minimum requirement, then the nearest equivalent is a grade 4.
- A grade 5 and above is considered a 'strong pass'. This will be used in measuring school performance.
- Fewer grade 9s will be awarded in each subject than A*s previously, rewarding exceptional performance




GCSE grading structure

Grade 9 is above A*

Grade 4 is equivalent to grade C

Grade 5 is top of grade C/grade B,

and a considered a STRONG PASS



Some facts about the GCSEs

- Majority have terminal exams
- A few have coursework DT, Art etc.
- Tiers in maths, science, MFL
- Science is worth 2 GCSEs and so receives two grades, from 1,1 to 9,9. The grades can be different, e.g. 5,6
- Some subjects are BTECs (vocational courses), e.g. music, performing arts, media studies,
- These are graded differently Distinction*, Distinction, Merit,
 Pass

Academic curriculum

- High quality teaching
- Purposeful homework to enhance learning
- Participate in every lesson
- Establish the right habits now
- Encourage your child to review new learning and revise from the start. Little and often!
- Encourage resilience
- Targeted interventions for students that require extra support.
 Additional revision sessions, online tutoring



Ongoing assessment and exam preparation

- Regular feedback for students and parents on targets and predicted grades, as well as effort, homework and attitude to learning
- Two formal assessment weeks during Year 10
- Mocks exams at the end of Year 10 to prepare for the final exams



- Study support is available in F56 on the following nights from W/B 19th September



How you can support your child

Attendance

- Excellent attendance is crucial in supporting your child with their learning goals and achieving their highest grades.
- 90% attendance over a school year = 4 whole weeks of lessons
 MISSED!
- Research suggests that 17 missed school days a year
 - = 1 GCSE grade DROP in achievement.

The greater the attendance the greater the attainment.


Punctuality

- Equally important is PUNCTUALITY to registrations and to all lessons
- Being late for a total of 15 minutes a day is the same as missing
 2 whole school weeks of lost learning!
- Support your child in getting to school on time by ensuring they:
 - Get enough sleep
 - Organise their bags the night before
 - Get up with plenty of time in the mornings
 - Discuss any lates with them

Log in and see all outstanding homework and when it is due:



The best conditions

- Diet, hydration, exercise, sleep
- Interest in school work, talk through Progress Checks, ask about homework, etc.
- Encourage a positive mind-set
- Encourage your child to ask if unsure
- Encourage them to make the most of opportunities available
- Encourage ongoing revision, from DAY ONE!
- Have key dates visible, and refer to them regularly

Reading is crucial

- 10 to 16 year-olds who read for pleasure do better at school.
- Parents are the most important reading role models for their children.
- Across the country, boys read at a lower level than girls. This affects their ability to pass English GCSE and lowers their success in other subjects.
- Where boys read for just 15 minutes a day, the impact on all of their learning has been shown to be transformational.
