Moving to Key Stage 4

- Expectations are still very high
- Demands and challenges are even greater
- GCSE subjects will require greater depth of study and new skills
- Every lesson, every homework, every piece of work – all will make a difference
- It's not all about results, but...
- Results will determine next steps, and that affects their future plans
- 100% effort will give the best results



Some facts about the GCSEs

- Majority have terminal exams
- A few have NEAs such as DT, Art etc.
- Tiers in Maths, Science, MFL
- Science is worth 2 GCSEs and so receives two grades, from 1,1 to 9,9. The grades can be different, e.g. 5,6
- Some subjects are vocational courses, e.g. Creative Media Production and Information Technology
- These are graded differently Distinction*, Distinction, Merit,
 Pass

Post 16 requirements

- All students must achieve a minimum of a grade 4 in English and Maths
- Students not achieving grade 4 in English or Maths will need to continue studying these subjects as part of their post-16 studies.





In school

- High quality teaching
- Regular feedback for students and parents on targets and predicted grades, as well as effort, homework and attitudes to learning
- Targeted interventions for students
- Develop key skills such as resilience, independence




Pastoral


Key information

- LEBC:
- An external partner that organises work experience placements
- They 'match' student placements based on their applications
- They ensure all work placements are risk assessed



What is work experience?

- One week Monday 8th Friday June 12th 2026
- Students experience a real working environment
- Develop key skills to support students in making their post 16 choices
- Explore a chosen job sector to see if it meets their expectations



Key work experience dates

- 9th September- Key Stage 4 Transition Evening
- 10th September- Work experience email
- 22nd September- Work experience application deadline
- 27th October- Self placement form deadline
- W/B 4th May- Work experience placements confirmed
- 4th April onwards students must contact their employers
- 8th June-12th June Work experience

Three key documents

- 1. Student directory: facts about the sectors available and future jobs
- 2. Online application form: all students MUST complete this form
- **3. Student self placement form**: this form must be completed **ONLY** if you are seeking a self organised placement
- You will receive all documents in an email on 10th September









Online application form-1

- Areas of work : Select 3 choices
- Job role: After each area of work, you will be asked to select a job role
- Students <u>must</u> be prepared to work in all <u>three</u> of their choices

Preferred Areas of Work and Job Roles


First Choice

Area of Work *




Travel areas

- What is in the local area?

- It is essential you consider travel when completing the application form, you must select 4 areas



Self placement

- The **employer** needs to complete the entire form and sign it
- All employers must have employers' liability insurance
- If the form is not fully completed it will **not** be accepted
- LEBC will then run associated Health and Safety checks

Building the right habits

- Establish the habits now
- Simple rewards to reinforce the right habits



Attendance and punctuality

- Attendance is crucial in supporting your child to achieve their potential
- 17 missed school days a year = 1 GCSE grade DROP in achievement.
- Equally important is PUNCTUALITY to registrations and to all lessons
- Key messages are given in registration
- The start of lessons are hugely important
- Ensure they organise their school bag the night before



The best conditions

- Diet, make sure they are hydrated, and get some exercise
- Distraction free environment
- Sleep is **essential** for success
- Encourage a positive mind-set
- Encourage them to make the most of opportunities and participate
- Encourage ongoing revision, from DAY ONE!

Transition tips for Key Stage 4

Make sure your child is aiming for 100% attendance between now and their final exams.



Encourage your child to read for pleasure. It's a great way to wind down before bed and is proven to reduce stress and improve academic performance.



Stick a copy of the **key dates** & their school timetable on the fridge so you are able to keep informed of upcoming events and to help your child get organised.



Make sure your child is punctual every day by helping them to get into positive habits such as organising their school bag the night before, and getting enough sleep.


